Literacy Word Reading	Children will learn: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To say a sound for all set 1 sounds. • To be able to blend CVC words verbally. • To read key words. • To read words containing familiar letter groups: 'that', 'shop', 'chin', 'feet' 'storm', 'night'. • To develop their phonological awareness to complete a rhyming string. • To use Fred fingers to identify how many sounds are in a word. • To recognise all taught Set 1 sounds including some digraphs. • To re-read phonetically decodable books to build up their confidence in word reading, their fluency and their understanding and enjoyment.

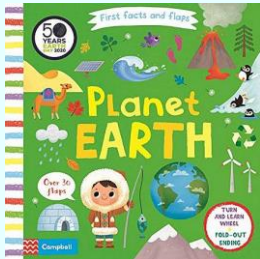

Self-Regulation

Children will learn:
