It also encourages respect and care for living creatures while developing language, understanding of habitats, and connections to their own outdoor experiences.

How You Can Help at Home

Linking to our topic we will be enjoying various stories including...



- Go on mini beast hunts in the garden, park, or on walks, encouraging children to look carefully under leaves or logs and talk about what they notice.
- Talk together about mini beasts you see, using simple vocabulary such as names, colours, sizes, and where they live.
- Read stories and non-fiction books about insects and small creatures to build curiosity and language.
- Encourage care and respect for living things by observing mini beasts gently and returning them to their habitats.

Children will visit our reading room where they will read for pleasure and chose a book to bring home.
