Reading

Your child will bring home a wordless book. Sharing wordless books is a terrific way to build important literacy skills including listening skills, vocabulary and comprehension. Please encourage your child to 'read' the book with their storytelling voice. Encourage more details using: Who? Where? When? Why? For a book with no words, you'll be surprised at all the talking you will do, and all the fun you will have.

How to Help at Home:

Talk with your child about stories. Ask them to draw or make their own monster and tell you what it looks like, where it lives, and what it likes to do. They could label it too and write the monsters name.
