Word	Definition
God	The eternal, supreme being who created and preserves all things.
Noah	The man who led the animals two by two onto the ark he built for the flood.
covenant	A formal agreement or promise.
sin	Making the wrong choice and disobeying God.
psalm	Teachings of how to express worship through all of life's situations.
sacraments	A visible sign or symbol of God's grace conferred on humans.
baptism	A ceremony that symbolizes a commitment to living a life as a Christian.
Father	The life-giver, the authority, and the powerful protector.
Bible	A group of religious texts which includes laws, stories, prayers, songs and wise words.
Old Testament/New Testament	The Bible is divided into two sections.

Hear
